SECTION 4. First aid measures

Description of first-aid measures

General advice First aider needs to protect himself.

Inhalation

After inhalation: fresh air. If breathing stops: mouth-to-mouth breathing or artificial respiration. Oxygen if necessary. Immediately call in physician.

Skin contact

After skin contact: wash off with plenty of water. Immediately remove contaminated clothing. If available swab with polyethylene glycol 400. Call a physician immediately.

Eye contact

After eye contact: rinse out with plenty of water. Immediately call in ophthalmologist.

Ingestion

After swallowing: make victim drink water (two glasses at most), avoid vomiting (risk of perforation!). Call a physician immediately. Do not attempt to neutralize.

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Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious person.

Most important symptoms and effects, both acute and delayed

Irritation and corrosion, conjunctivitis, bronchitis, Cough, Shortness of breath, agitation, spasms, Risk of corneal clouding. Risk of blindness!

Indication of any immediate medical attention and special treatment needed

SECTION 5. Fire-fighting measures

Extinguishing media

Suitable extinguishing media Carbon dioxide (CO2), Foam, Dry powder

Unsuitable extinguishing media For this substance/mixture no limitations of extinguishing agents are given.

Special hazards arising from the substance or mixture

Combustible. Vapors are heavier than air and may spread along floors. Forms explosive mixtures with air at ambient temperatures. Pay attention to flashback. Development of hazardous combustion gases or vapors possible in the event of fire. Fire may cause evolution of: nitrous gases

Advice for firefighters

Special protective equipment for fire-fighters Stay in danger area only with self-contained breathing apparatus. Prevent skin contact by keeping a safe distance or by wearing suitable protective clothing.

Further information

Suppress (knock down) gases/vapors/mists with a water spray jet. Prevent fire extinguishing water from contaminating surface water or the ground water system. Remove container from danger zone and cool with water.

SECTION 6. Accidental release measures

Personal precautions, protective equipment and emergency procedures

Advice for non-emergency personnel: Do not breathe vapors, aerosols. Avoid substance contact. Ensure adequate ventilation. Keep away from heat and sources of ignition. Evacuate the danger area, observe emergency procedures, consult an expert.

Advice for emergency responders: Protective equipment see section 8.

Environmental precautions

Do not empty into drains. Risk of explosion.

Methods and materials for containment and cleaning up

Cover drains. Collect, bind, and pump off spills. Observe possible material restrictions (see sections 7 and 10).

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Take up with liquid-absorbent and neutralizing material (e.g. Chemizorb® OH⁻, Merck Art. No. 101596). Dispose of properly. Clean up affected area.

SECTION 7. Handling and storage

Precautions for safe handling

Work under hood. Do not inhale substance/mixture. Avoid generation of vapors/aerosols.

Observe label precautions.

Advice on protection against fire and explosion Keep away from open flames, hot surfaces and sources of ignition. Take precautionary measures against static discharge.

Conditions for safe storage, including any incompatibilities

Keep away from heat and sources of ignition. Keep container tightly closed in a dry and wellventilated place.

Store at +15°C to +25°C (+59°F to +77°F).

Engineering measures

Technical measures and appropriate working operations should be given priority over the use of personal protective equipment.
